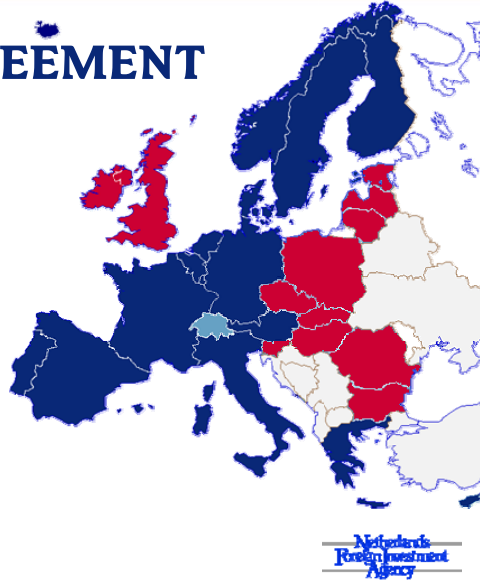

THE SCHENGEN AGREEMENT

- The countries
- From 5 to 25 countries
- Non-Schengen countries

- Implementing countries
- Members not yet implemented
- Partly implementing countries



BUSINESS VISA

- Foreign nationals travelling to the Netherlands
- Dutch visa = Schengen visa
- Single entry or multiple entry
- Up to 3 months
- Rules and regulations:

ORANGE CARPET VISA FACILITY

- Frequent/ VIP travellers to the Netherlands
- Registration at the Embassy, and then:
 - Applying for the visa without an appointment
 - Usual rules and regulations: ready in the afternoon

Pioneers in international business

WORK PERMITS

- Labour migrant
- Maximum 3 years
- Strict requirements or internal transfer
- Application to Center for Work and Income

RESIDENCE PERMITS

- Upon arriving in the Netherlands
- Free acceptance of employment after 3 years
- Population Register

HIGHLY SKILLED MIGRANTS

- Highly skilled migrants:
 - Coming to the Netherlands to work as an employee
 - Earning at least € 49,087 (2009)
- No work permit required
- Application to Immigration and Naturalisation Service (IND)
